

BIOGRAPHY

Slobodan I. Babic was born in Tuzla, Bosnia and Herzegovina. He received the Dipl. Ing. degree from the Faculty of Electrical Engineering, University of Sarajevo, the M.Sc. degree from the Faculty of Electrical Engineering, University of Zagreb, Croatia, and the Ph.D. degree from the Faculty of Electrical Engineering, University of Sarajevo, Bosnia and Herzegovina, in 1975, 1980 and 1992, respectively. From 1975, he was with the Electrical Engineering Faculty of the University of Sarajevo, where he held an Associate Professor position until 1994. Since 1997 he has lectured on the subjects of physics and electrical engineering with the École Polytechnique de Montréal, Montréal, QC, Canada in the Department of Electrical Engineering and in the Department of Physics. His major interests are in the mathematical modeling of stationary and quasi-stationary fields, computational electromagnetics, magnetic materials, and field theory. He has authored or co-authored over 100 papers in major journals and conference proceedings. His research papers have been highly cited for over 400 times. He is a member of the International Compumag Society, a member of the Editorial Board for the International Journal of Computer Aided Engineering & Technology, the Editor-in-chief for the WSEAS Transactions on Power Systems and a reviewer for IEEE Transactions on Magnetics, International Journal of Computer Aided Engineering and Technology, Journal of Electromagnetic Waves & Applications, PIER and WSEAS Transactions on Power Systems.
